Your vote is your right

Mental health patients have the same right to vote as the general population

You can vote if you are a:

- Patient in the community
- Voluntary patient in a mental health hospital
- Patient under civil sections
- Patient on a Community Treatment Order
- Patient who lacks capacity
- Patient who is homeless or in B&B accommodation
- Prisoner on remand to hospital under the Mental Health Act on Sections 35, 36 or 48

You can get support to vote

If you are an inpatient you can ask for leave to vote or request to vote by post
