

Bowel Cancer Screening



NHS offers tests to help find Cancer sooner.

Finding Cancer early means treatment is easier.

This is called the **National Cancer Screening Programme.**



The Bowel is inside your stomach. Bowel takes away waste from your body. The waste is called poo



NHS will send the Bowel Cancer Screening test to your home address.

You can do the test at home. It looks for blood in the poo



After doing the test you can post the kit back to NHS.



Bowel Cancer screening is offered to people who are 54 to 74 years old
You will be asked to test every 2 years until 75 years old

If you have symptoms of bowel cancer like



- Blood in poo that looks red or black
- Changes in poo that feels softer or harder



- Pain or lump in tummy
- Feeling like you need to poo but cannot
- Feeling tired or bloated
- Losing weight



Do not wait for your screening if you symptoms. **Talk to your GP quickly**
