

Cervical Cancer Screening



NHS offers tests to help find Cancer sooner.

Finding Cancer early means treatment is easier.

This is called the **National Cancer Screening Programme.**



The Cervix is inside your body above the vagina.

You cannot see it



Doctor or nurse will do a test to check for a virus to treat you early.

This is called Cervical Screening.



Cervical screening is offered to:

- Women
- Between the age of 25 - 64



Your GP will write to you to invite you for the Screening appointment.



You can have the screening:

- Every 3 years between age of 25-49
- Every 5 years between age of 50-64



If you have symptoms of cervical cancer such as:

- Unusual bleeding or discharge in the vagina
- Pain in your back or lower belly
- Heavier periods



Do not wait for your next Cancer Screening appointment.
